# *IN MEMORY*



It is with sadness that we report that another of our alumni, Nancy Parker Petrov, 72, passed away on August 29, 2022, ending nine months of a struggle with Covid-19 & its complications. While attending GHHS, Nancy participated in Block "G", Booster Club, Future Teachers, Intramurals, Spanish Club, Ski Club, Showboat and was a Homeroom Officer. She was also a member of the National Honor Society. She had moved to the Cleveland area as a teenager & graduated from GHHS & Cleveland State University. She also earned a master's degree in social work at the Mandel School of Applied Social Sciences of Case Western Reserve University, and then worked for many years as a social worker

at the Cleveland Clinic. Nancy is survived by her husband of 49 years, Alan, and three children. She was also blessed with three grandchildren.



We are also saddened to learn that former faculty member, Mr. William Toneff, passed away on October 11, 2022. He was 103! Mr. Toneff initially began his career at GHHS at the age of 30 as a music teacher & choir director in 1947; his entire career was at Garfield. He was also the first director of the Triple Trio that began at GHHS during the 1956-57 school year, and was also the director or sponsor for 10 years leading the Glee Club. By the 1957-58 school year, he began teaching English and continued to do so until his retirement. He married Ann Thornton Toneff and enjoyed 68 years of marriage with her. Ann was a primary teacher of the GH Public Schools and taught there for 30 years. She passed away April 15, 2017. Mr. Toneff was a veteran of WWII. He obtained the rank of 1st Lieutenant & served in the U.S. Army Field Artillery, Battery B, 391st Battalion, 3rd Armored Division, 1st Army. He was twice wounded & received the Purple Heart with Oak Leaf Cluster & a Bronze Star for Bravery. In 2018, when 99, he led the City of Brecksville Memorial Day parade as its Grand Marshall. He was also its Memorial Day speaker &

received a Proclamation of Appreciation by the City. He & Ann were also avid birders and during their retirement were always in pursuit of spying species of birds. They were members of the Kirtland Bird Club & had many bird sighting lists recorded in notebooks from many travels within the USA, Canada, and their "backyard" close to the Cuyahoga Valley National Park. Mr. Toneff was a special faculty member of GHHS, as well as a wonderful human being. He will be greatly missed by many, including the staff & students of GHHS!




